


KS3 Activities - Answers

Mapping Canterbury

- 1- The Westgate Towers the west-facing city gate, one of eight original gates.
- 2- The Chequer of Hope Inn Inn where pilgrims would stay.
- 3- Age UK Old Victorian Bootmakers
- 4- East Bridge Hospital a hospice which provided accommodation for pilgrims.
- 5- The Cathedral Gate-leading to the Cathedral, where Becket's shrine is.
- 6- The Sidney Cooper Gallery named after the Victorian Canterbury artist



Timeline Quiz

- 1- The Cantiaci, a Celtic tribe, lived here and left evidence of pottery, ironworks and keeping cattle behind.
 - Romans invaded and started to settle AD 43.

- Durovernum Cantiacorum established AD 70. Buildings erected in stone including walls, gates, temples, amphitheatre, etc.
- 2- Anglo Saxons took over as Roman Empire fell. AD 600 Canta-wara-byrig was established as capital of the kingdom of Kent. St Augustine founded the abbey and monastery of Christ Church soon after arriving in 597.
- 3- Norman Conquest 1066
 Becket murdered in Canterbury Cathedral 1170
 Pilgrimages to Canterbury begin when he is made a saint.
- 4- Eastbridge Hosptial, founded in 1190, was a place for pilgrims to stay. What is the name of another inn where Chaucer's pilgrims might have stayed? THE CHEQUER OF HOPF INN
- 5- Chaucer born 1343, wrote Canterbury Tales 1387 and died 1400 a favourite of the Crown.
 - He was buried in a particular corner of Westminster Abbey. What is this corner called? **POETS' CORNER**
- 6- The Westgate Tower, built around 1380, is the largest surviving city gate in England. What else was it used for? DEFENSE OF THE CITY/ AN ENTRANCE FOR PILGRIMS/ CLOSE AT NIGHTFALL TO STOP PEOPLE ENTERING THE CITY AFTER CURFEW
- 7- 1500's and 1600's Reformation and Dissolution of the Monasteries.

 French Hugenots and other Protestants from the Low Countries seek refuge in
 Canterbury, bringing their skills as weavers, workers of luxury goods, brick-making
 and more.
